with a '63 Hawk. Bret Parker brought a '47 M series truck. Beautiful cars.



# Hello from Sapulpa

I had an interesting dilemma when I went to the Tag Office (Oklahoma's equivalent to the DMV). I took my Studebaker down there to transfer title from California to Oklahoma but was unable to get it done. (BTW, there were no lines.) We got the paperwork done for the truck and went outside to verify the VIN and to read the milage on the odometer. I could not find a tag with the number California had listed on my pink slip as a VIN. I found a tag, but the number did not match. I don't think they even looked for that number in California as I couldn't remember where it was. I looked in several places and began to panic. I started calling friends that I thought would know where to find it and Rick Pierce gave me the bad news that it was stamped on the engine block. Indeed, Studebaker used the engine number and even if they asked to see it when I bought the truck, it was there to find. When I replaced the original motor with the new running gear, long gone was that verification data. The lady at the tag office didn't know what to do and neither did I. This was my challenge.

I came home empty handed and decided I had better check the car to see if I would have the same problem with it. Sure enough, they had used the engine number on it too. The number on the B pillar was a body number and not the same as the number on the title. Anthony was the first person I called, and I just left a message on his phone before I called Rick and got the answer. Anthony called me back and we talked about how I could get around this dilemma and he told me that Bob Peterson knew a guy that could make me a plate with that number on it. I called him and within a week I had what I needed to get it done.

I don't have a build sheet for the truck, but I do have one for the car. The build sheet has the body number that is on the B pillar plate and also has the engine number on it that matches the VIN number on my California title paperwork. That may have worked if I didn't have the plate made but I'm sure it would entail more paperwork. The Tag Office verified the number on the plate I had made and didn't even challenge it as the plate looks authentic. So, if you've replaced the original motor in your old Studebaker, and your title uses the engine number as the VIN, you might want to get this taken care of before it becomes an issue. If you sell the car, or move to another state, as I did, it could be a serious problem when it is time to register it again. At a minimum, I would recommend that you get the build sheet from SDC. To make it easy, having a plate made with the original engine number and attaching it to the car might be your best bet. It would save you, or whoever ends up with your car, a lot of hassle.

And as a final note, I was not looking forward to giving up my SDUDE and S2UDE license plates. I checked with the Tag Office to see if I could get those plates in Oklahoma and was delighted to find out that both of them were available. So, I have ordered them, and I am just waiting for them to be delivered by mail.

I have reached out to the president of the local SDC Chapter and plan to attend my first meeting with them this month. They haven't been meeting since the pandemic started last year but are anxious to get going again. I've been in contact with Bob Foster and he's ready to join too. Bob lives less than 30 minutes away from me. There's going to be a big car show here in Sapulpa in June as they have a Route 66 celebration every year. Route 66 goes right through our town. I'll polish up the Studebakers when it stops raining...

# Tech Tips Lug Nuts and Wheels by Brian Challender

How many of us are still riding on the original Studebaker wheels that the car was equipped with from the factory? If I had to guess, probably not that many. Over the years the wheels have been replaced with after market wheels or with wheels from another car manufacturer. The hub lug nut pattern is 41/2"x5". This same size was used on both Ford and Chrysler products over the years and will fit most Studebaker passenger cars from the 50s and 60s. The reason that Studebaker wheels have been replaced is because the original rim width was pretty narrow and was designed for skinny bias tires used at the time. Modern tires are wider and are of a radial design that provides better traction and control in all weather conditions. This requires a wheel that is wider than the factory Studebaker rims that came with the car. In fact putting wider radial tires on Studebaker rims can be dangerous. If your Studebaker has after market wheels, such as mags or custom wheels they were most likely sold with lug nuts for that application. If over the years the wheels have been replaced already, putting on a set of modern radial tires is a smart idea. Maybe your car already has radial tires. An overlooked problem is when the wheels were replaced, the same small lug nuts were reused. The reason this can be a problem is that the lug nut holes in the Ford or Chrysler wheels are slightly lager and use a correspondingly larger lug nut. The smaller lug nut used by Studebaker will work. For awhile. Over time, as the wheels are taken off to replace the tires and then reinstalled, each time the lug nuts are torqued they "dig in" a little deeper into the wheel. This can result in the wheel not being secured properly to the hub and coming off while driving. The correct lug nuts will use a 13/16" size wrench. The Studebaker wrench size is 3/4". Now days lug nuts have to be ordered by application. A late 70s Ford pickup truck lug nut will be the right stud size and tread pitch for your Studebaker car. You will also need to get a universal "star" lug nut wrench as the one that came with your car won't fit. So go out and look at your wheels with the wheel covers off and do a quick inspection. Be sure to check all four wheels. You never know what the previous owner did or didn't do.
