Placerville Truly Celebrates John M Studebaker!

SDC members recently had the pleasure of displaying their Studebakers at the El Dorado County fair in concert with the 70th Running of the John M Studebaker Wheelbarrow race. I was joined by Karel Staple members Dean Sumpter and Steve Van Norman, Doug VanPool from the Sage Brush chapter, SDC President Carl Thomason and Anne and David Goodman from the San Joaquin Chapter.

We had a good representation of post war Studes including a 51 Champion Bullet nose, a 53 Loewy coupe, a 57 Golden Hawk, a 61 Hawk, a 62 Lark and a 56 pickup. Our cars were displayed near the El Dorado County museum and we spent a good part of the day sharing information about our cars and Studebaker lore. I was very impressed by the number of folks who knew the part John M Studebaker played in Gold rush history in Old Hangtown. I was even more impressed during the opening ceremonies of the wheelbarrow races when they told the Studebaker story and how John Studebaker became known as Wheelbarrow Johnny. Through all this it became clear to me what an important chapter in Studebaker history that Placerville played.

When John Mohler was offered a job building wheelbarrows for \$10 each, he was eventually able to save over \$8,000 which he took back to South Bend and provided the capital needed to enable Studebaker to become the largest wagon

manufacturer in the world just 20 years later. I also learned the he came back to Placerville for a visit in 1912 where he was treated as a grand celebrity with a 3 day celebration. One has to wonder if Studebaker Corporation would have ever become what it did if he had not been able to build that stake in Placerville.

Now the races themselves are also pretty special. They began in 1938 and only took a break during World War II. They are a challenging events where racers have to push a replica of original Wheelbarrow Johnny wheelbarrows, fill them with 50 pounds of sand, and then navigate over and through obstacles including fallen trees, log jams, railroad ties, up and down hills and finally through a 5 foot deep mud hole. They have classes with varying weights for men,



women, seniors, teenagers, high school teams and younger kids. The winners of the Men's and Women's race each earned \$1,000. While one might think this would be a young person's race, the winner of the Men's Race (for his 9th time!) was 57 year old Brian Veerkamp who bested a large field.

The race is sponsored by the Placerville Kiwanis who invited us to participate. They were very happy to have us and we both hope it will become an annual event for Karel Staple and other chapters. So mark your calendars for the Saturday before Father's Day and come join the fun. Let's be a part of this great event honoring a Studebaker founder. For the athletic and ambitious, it is never too early to start training! I understand lung conditioning is the real key to success! Hope you enjoy the pictures from our display and from the race itself.

2014 SDC International Meet

When Tim noticed that the 2014 Studebaker Drivers Club International Meet would be held in Dover, Delaware, he got excited because he used to live in that area. He told me that there would be tours of Washington, DC, which I had never seen before, and that got me excited. So the decision was made to go for it and attend the 2014 SDC meet on the East Coast from Sunday, June 29 to Saturday, July 5. Fortunately, we were able to stay with some long-time Navy friends of Tim's. Since the meet would be held 3,000 miles from home, no other Karel Staple club members planned to attend. But we did feel like we were among family members since everyone was there because of their love for the amazing Studebaker vehicles. We met some wonderful Studebaker "family" members from around the country and around the world. Australia was well represented and a couple was there from the Netherlands.



The DelMarVa (Delaware, Maryland, Virginia) Studebaker Club hosted the event and treated everyone warmly, starting from registration to the final Farewell Breakfast. The DelMarVa Club is fairly new, about 8 years old, having been formed from a couple of smaller Studebaker clubs in the area. The event was held at the world famous Dover Downs race track, Hotel/Casino. This was the 50th Golden SDC Meet and the DelMarVa Club did the job right by having an abundance of activities related to Studebakers and fun for all family members. The meet was also co-hosted by the Avanti Owners Association International and the Antique Studebaker Club.

There were hundreds of Studebakers, Avantis and Weasels from all over the world, memorabilia, displays, an enormous swap meet, and classes or seminars every day of the week, in addition to many tours of the area. The DelMarVa Club members did an especially nice job of the SDC Welcome Night on Monday and the Family Fun Night on Thursday, with a band and delightful appetizers. There even were Studebaker Choir and Band performances!

For Tim it was returning to his old neighborhood. He had lived in Salisbury, MD, for 3 years while he worked at the NASA base on Wallops Island, VA, and got his Master's degree at Wilmington College in Dover, Delaware. His daughter was born during this time, and this is where he did the full restoration of his 1957 Silver Hawk. We did take the tour of the present day NASA base, so I got to see where Tim used to work, which was a treat for both of us. We did two other one day tours of Washington, D.C., right before the 4th of July, so we got to see the Capital prepare for our Nation's Birthday! On July 4th, we watched the fireworks in Dover, the capital city of Delaware, the first State of the Union!!

The vendors were quite helpful and Tim scored big time with an antenna for his Hawk, (of course, it was tricky to get past the TSA agents on the way back as it was too big to fit in his suitcase!) in addition to some special replacement buttons for the dashboard.

We saw some Weasels which were small U.S. military transportation vehicles with Studebaker engines that were used during WWII, some of which had been manufactured nearby in Delaware. There were several specimens in pristine condition on display at the convention.

Some of the tours included:

A tour of the QVC (TV shopping) studio; tour the Weasel Museum and Factory; tour of Ft. McHenry, Baltimore; Ocean City Beach tour; and the three that we enjoyed: NASA Space Flight Facility, DC National Mall (we saw all the Smithsonians in one day, we actually went into two!! Ok, I was in a power scooter and Tim struggled to keep up), and the DC Monuments & Union Station. And, of course, there were several driving tours designed specifically for the Studebaker drivers. Since we were at Dover Downs, a Hot Lap was scheduled for riders to go 185 mph in a race car, but it was canceled (Tim was upset!)

A Sea Glass Jewelry Making workshop was held and there were some beautiful keepsakes on sale that were made from items sea-worn and washed up onto the Delaware beaches. A Ladies' Victorian Tea Luncheon was a popular event for many women. Attendees were even allowed to finger paint a Bullet Nose, this was fun for the kids! Unfortu-



nately, the Miss Delaware Car Wash was held on Wednesday, when Hurricane Andrew passed by. It rained like crazy, and we never heard what happened with that event. There were many Regional and Zone meetings that took place, and too many other activities to mention in one article.



The Concours d'Elegance on Thursday was spectacular! There must have been a couple thousand Studebakers, from 1922 Touring beauties to 2008 Avantis. The Best of Show was a 1931 President Four Seasons Roadster, one of the most stunning vehicles we have ever seen. All the owners were very friendly, from the Delaware farmer with a 1947 farm truck to the folks with the fancy 2008 Avantis. There were rows and rows of Studebakers. Unfortunately, it was one of those horribly hot, humid days, so I only made it through a few rows before almost getting heat stroke. I especially enjoyed the pre-war and early post-war models.

But Tim looked at all the cars, and the trucks, and Weasels, too!

The Awards Banquet in the Grand Ballroom on Friday night was delicious and entertaining. The hotel staff performed the "Happy" song by Pharrell Williams while carrying our desserts and sparklers around the ballroom! Even though they prepared hundreds of dinners that evening, ours tasted like it was prepared just for us.

We did take a side trip to Winchester, VA, where I had paternal ancestors that founded the town and fought in the Revolutionary war. We saw buildings that they built 250 years ago still in use and many names on gravestones in the Mt. Hebron Cemetery (but none still living). We returned to Dover by way of Ocean City, MD, which is much like Santa Cruz here on the West Coast. I got to put my feet in the Atlantic Ocean for the first time, so I am now officially bi-coastal. We also saw the sign that says: "Sacramento, CA 3073 miles", which had made Tim homesick for many years.
