

Shootin' the Breeze With The Studebaker Dude

Studebaker and the Post Office Department

I spent a good portion of my life caring about two American icons. The Postal Service (formerly known as the Post Office Department) and the Studebaker Corporation. The Post Office dates back to Benjamin Franklin and Studebaker was building vehicles long before the day of the automobile. Postal history tells us that many of the roads in this country were created so that mail could be delivered to rural addresses. And as far as the western migration, many of the wagons traversing America were built by Studebaker.

Studebaker was a huge wagon and carriage manufacturing company. Their company motto and reputation was built on giving the customer more than they promised. As the Post Office Department expanded their delivery area, they needed vehicles to haul it. Studebaker was certainly a logical choice to deliver these vehicles and they were familiar with government contracts. They had the facilities to mass produce and a reputation for quality. While they were not used exclusively, they certainly produced their fair share of the desired vehicles.

It was the late 1890s and early 1900s that the horseless carriages, or what would later be known as the automobile, became all the rage. In the beginning they were toys for the wealthy but the introduction of the Model T Ford in 1908 changed everything. Cars were now affordable to the everyday person and the competition of the Model T Ford brought many an enthusiastic entrepreneur into the automobile business. Studebaker reluctantly got into the auto business in 1902 with an electric car. They hesitated because they were so successful building horse drawn wagons that they weren't even interested in these new-fangled horseless buggies. They were certainly in a good position to be successful as their manufacturing plants were big enough to handle the job.

They went in partnership with other car manufacturers such as

Studebaker ventured out alone putting their name on an automobile. They were tasked with building motorized postal vehicles and added their take on what would eventually become part of the American scenery.

Studebaker decided to give up on automobile production in the early 60s. Competition from the "Big Three", GM, Ford, and Chrysler eventually forced the independent automakers out and Studebaker was one of the



casualties. But before they decided to move auto production to Canada in 1963, Studebaker had been awarded a contract to build a fleet of Post Office delivery vehicles. Studebaker completed that contract after they stopped building cars in South Bend, building a total of 4238 vehicles for the Post Office.

U. S. MAIL COLLECTOR'S WAGO!

The Zip Van was built specifically for city delivery. Studebaker built the frames and provided it's inline 6-cylinder motors and automatic transmissions for power. They had a unique dual pedal system that allowed the trucks to be driven from a standing position or seated in a fold up seat. This allowed carriers on dismount delivery routes to easily jump in and out of the vehicle to deliver the mail to boxes that could not be reached from a seated driving position. This type of delivery

Continued from Pg 4 has long ago been deemed too dangerous and is no longer an approved method of delivering mail. The bodies were built by the Met-Pro company in Lansdale Pennsylvania. The two parts were assembled together and distributed to Post Offices throughout the United States. By the time the Post Office Department morphed into the Postal Service, all zip Vans were long retired. As a side note, the name Zip Van was used to publicize the new Zone Improvement Plan, or Zip Code that was created at the same time-period. Yes, I remember the days before zip codes.

Studebaker went on to produce automobiles in Canada for model years 1965 and 1966. After that, Studebaker cars were no more. Soon, the Post Office Department would also be no more. Today's Postal Service replaced it. We still get our mail like we did under the old system however, Studebakers are no longer being made. But they are not gone. Thanks to about 18,000 members world-wide, Studebakers are being restored and maintained for all to see. And the best part is that they are still being driven.


