Studebaker Maintenance Anxieties (Not for the faint of heart)

Studebaker maintenance anxieties. By Mel France

The back window of my 1962 Lark Cruiser was broken during a wind storm last Fall. Ford and General Motors people don't have a clue how difficult it is to find parts for cars that do not have millions of new reproduction parts being produced for them every day. In 1962, Studebaker only made 143 cars with a back window the same shape as mine. 1962 Larks had four different back windows.

After continuously looking for months, I decided to cut the top off the car and only drive it in Summer. On the day I was going to start chopping, I saw a Lark Cruiser just like it on EBay; except, it had the back window one would actually be able to find. After evaluating the pictures, I decided it was probably worth about fifteen hundred to two thousand dollars; so, naturally, I bid thirty five hundred dollars, like an idiot. I was high bidder right up until the day it sold. You guessed it, a couple of days before it sold, I found someone who had the correct window in a car abandoned in his front yard for thirty years; and, he gave it to me. Oh man! Now I was going to be obliged to purchase a car that was fifteen hundred miles away, that I did not need nor want, for fifteen hundred dollars more than it was worth. But when the confirmation came back, the owner decided bidding was not high enough to meet his reserve. What a relief!

Studebaker windows have to be removed from the inside. My relationship with the bees, pincher bugs, and rats, complete with feces, while laboring inside that Lark, is fodder for another story.


Subject: Getting rid of VAPOR LOCK, tech. tip

With the fuel today that I understand boils at 130*, vapor lock is a real problem. So many of the old cars have the fuel pump located at the front of the engine, sandwiched between a hot engine and the hot radiator. Back when these cars were built we had real gasoline, not this crap of today and the location of the fuel pump was not a problem. Things are different today and here is one way to over come this problem. Remove the engine fuel pump and install a cover where the fuel pump was. These are available at most all auto supplies. Purchase an electric fuel pump and install it as close to the fuel supply as you can. Electric fuel pumps are pushers so they need to be close to the supply. For safety reasons, connect the hot wire first to the ACC. terminal of the IGN. Switch, then to a 15 amp circuit breaker, then to a toggle switch. This is to be able to turn the pump off if there was a leak or for what ever reason. Next purchase an in line fuel filter that has a smaller side port, reroute the fuel line to come up along the fire wall high enough to go across the fire wall above the engine, install the inline fuel filter and continue to the carburetor. From the smaller side port of the filter run another line back to the fuel tank. Use rubber gas line at both ends of this line. Where ever you can, drill a hole in the fuel tank filler pipe and install a fitting so you can connect the return line. The filler pipe is thick enough if you drill and install a 1/8" NPT fitting that you can connect to. Now you have the fuel away from the heat of the engine and with the return line you also have excess fuel running back to the tank so fuel doesn't not stay in one place long enough to get hot and cause vapor lock. This has been done many times and is the only fix that seams to work well.

Even if your car does not have the fuel pump as mentioned, if you have a vapor lock problem, this will fix it.
