


a teen era Franklin. That car was at least an orphan. It was way cool too. Steve and Kelli

members and do


have a Studebaker. He dressed down for this meeting after I teased him about showing up at a previous meeting looking like a politician.

Tech Tips

Nuts & Bolts

I want to pass along a few tidbits on threaded fasteners.

Grades of steel bolts. Steel bolts come in different strengths, most popular are grades 2, 5 & 8.

The heads of the bolts should have markings on them indicting which grade of bolt. These are

generally equally spaded radial lines. A grade 2 bolt will have no markings on the head of the

bolt. A grade 5 will have 3 radial lines and a grade 8 will have 5 lines. Grade 2 bolts I do not

use or keep in my shop, I believe they are too weak of a fastener and if accidentally got used where a grade 5 or 8 bolt is required the chances of failure is high. A grade 5 bolt is a good all around, fits most applications. Grade 8 are stronger, they are hardened, and used in unique or special applications. One feature between a grade 5 & 8 bolt; a grade 5 will bend before it breaks, an 8 will snap/break before it bends.

Stainless Bolts, are great in some applications and terrible for others. The two most popular materials are 316 and 304 alloys. 316 has no iron in the alloy, it won't rust or stain, polishes up nice, great for show. 304 has a little iron in its alloy causing the bolt to show a little staining on the surface, and is a little stronger than 316. Need a stainless bolt to function, use 304, need it to show, 316. Both these bolts are weaker than a grade 5 bolt. Don't ever use a stainless bolt for an electrical connection. The hotter stainless gets the more it impedes the flow of electricity. Example, your battery ground cable to the engine block.

Coating bolt threads. Rarely do I ever install a bolt with dry threads. I've had to remove a number of fasteners using the appropriate expletive to get them out, and some of them were mine that I installed a long time ago. Don't be afraid to put a little something on bolt threads. Engine oil, grease, anti seize (my favorite). For electrical connections use Di-Electric grease (silicone grease) this product doesn't conduct electricity or impede the flow of electricity.

Bolts get over looked, give them some attention. After all without them, our Studebakers would all be in pieces.
