# WELCOME NEW MEMBERS Meet William and Norma Wunderlich

I was born in 1946. Raised in a small town in northeast Nebraska. In the Fall of 1964, I enrolled in the pre-law program at the University of Nebraska. At a freshman student mixer on the first weekend of classes, I met Norma Jean Pace. We married the following January. Our first son, Bob, was born the following January and our second son, Bill, was born 18 months later.

Graduated in June, 1968, and moved the family to Sacramento to attend UOP's McGeorge School of Law. Attended the 4 year night school program while working full-time as a consultant at the CA



State Assembly. Graduated in June, 1972. Took the August 72 Bar Exam. Our third son, Brian, arrived the night before the exam started, but I passed nonetheless.

Sworn in as an Attorney in December, 1972, and the following February, 1973, became a Deputy District Attorney for Monterey County. Worked as a prosecutor, with Some time in private practice, until 1984, when I won a seat on the

Monterey County Superior Court by defeating an incumbent judge In the June election. I remained on the Superior Court until February, 1993, when then Governor Pete Wilson elevated me to the Ca Court of Appeals.

I served on the 6th District Court, with my chambers in San Jose.

In 2004, after 20 years as a state judge, I left to take a federal position. I was appointed as the Federal Magistrate presiding over the small U.S. District Court in Yosemite National Park. The job included the right to rent a home near the foot of Yosemite Falls. This position is widely considered the most desirable judicial posting anywhere in the nation.

For medical reasons, I took an early retirement in June, 2009. Norma and I are retired in the Redding area, with which we became familiar during several houseboat excursions in the 80s and 90s. We currently own a houseboat moored on Lake Shasta. We began taking ocean cruises in 1989 and have, on average, taken a couple each year since. We will celebrate our 56th wedding anniversary next January.



# Tesla electric motors to soon power V8 muscle cars with this new crate motor Story by Fred Lambert

EV West has unveiled its new Tesla crate motor mount kit to drop into V8 muscle cars in electric conversion projects. Tesla electric motors have become a staple of electric vehicle conversions. Their power has made

them popular with people making drag strip electric monsters or even just wanting to have some torque underneath them in cool classic car conversions. We have seen many crazy electric car conversion projects using Tesla's powerful electric motors and a variety of different battery packs.

Some companies have been trying to make it easier to upgrade a vehicle with salvaged Tesla motors by packaging them to fit in cars and developing controllers for them. Now EV West, a popular EV parts and conversion shop in Cali-



fornia, has unveiled their own Tesla crate motor for muscle EV conversions: As you can see, it's an entire Tesla drive unit with power inverter and the brackets to be mounted like a block motor.

EV West wrote in the product announcement:

Ready for a Tesla drive in your V8 muscle car? We have you covered. Our new Revolt Tesla crate motor mounts to your small block motor mounts and attaches directly to your driveshaft allowing you to use your existing rear axle. A huge time and money saver. It also allows you to change gear ratios in your third member. As they point out, it should save time in an EV conversion by greatly simplifying the motor mounting, which could also save money. However, they haven't released the price yet, and while they say it will save money, don't expect the kit to be cheap. EV conversions can be expensive and often runs into the tens of thousands of dollars.

After you have your electric motors, you also need battery modules to feed it and a way to mount those in the vehicle. Check out our EV conversion section for some of the coolest projects we have covered over the years.
